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a decade of research in primary care in the Netherlands 1972 - 1982

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A disadvantage to countries whose language is not widely spoken, such as the Netherlands, is that their products of scolarship and science will not easily become known abroad. Research results tend to be published in the language of the investigator. Foreign journals, apparently, are not readily accessible in practice.

Thus, during the past ten years much research has been conducted in the Netherlands in the field of primary health care, which has hardly been noted abroad.

This is a pity, though. For in the Netherlands much research, and to our view of high quality at that, is undertaken in the field of primary health care. A national institute (grant-aided by the Ministry of Welfare, Public Health and Culture), the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners (NHI) as well as eight University Institutes of General Practitioners are engaged in consistent research programmes concerning general medicine and primary care. But elsewhere, too, in numerous other university-based or non-university institutes, in the individual general practice and health centre, a great deal of study in this respect is carried out. The Netherlands College of General Practitioners (NHG) has a special committee for the purpose: the Scientific Research Committee.

For ten years now, the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners has kept a registration system of all current research projects in this field. On the occasion of the tenth anniversary the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners and the Netherlands College of General Practitioners decided to produce jointly a decennial publication in English for the explicit purpose of informing a more international readership of Dutch research in the area of primary

health care.

The book consists of a general section which presents a survey of the present state of affairs. In this, a number of factual findings is reviewed, including

- who are the performers of research
- how long do the projects take
- what are the usual mediums of communication Here, too, the developments that occurred in the past decade are already considered. In addition the research projects (452 in number) are classed under a number of headings; in doing so the strongly developed and underdeveloped subjects are discussed.

The second (and by far the greater) part describes in brief each of the studies that are included in the introductory survey, adhering to the classification adopted in the survey. Thus the studies that are referred to in relation to the various categories are easily looked up.

For every investigation an abstract of its problem definition or object is given. The investigator's name as well as the name of the research institute are also included in each case. This we did with the specific intention that an interested reader may contact on his/her own initiative the investigator in question, in order to be further informed of the details and results of the study in a more personal contact.

We included a few data on the duration and any ... publications in order to give a general impression of the topical interest and relevance of the project. If under the heading of publications it is stated that none are available, this implies that never—theless all of the research data are open to the public, i.e., on principle to any applications that may be made for them.

At the end of the book further references can be found — an index and a list of the names and addresses of research institutes — which turn this into a complete reference work.

We hope that a need will be filled by this book.

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The Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners has been keeping a Registration System of current research in and into primary health care since 1972. Annual reports are published in which the latest data are included. The tenth anniversary of the system is the occasion to give for once a complete review of all research conducted during the past ten years in the field of primary health care in the Netherlands. It also presents a suitable moment to strike a balance.

At the time when the Registration System was established, the objective was: to make available to everyone the most extensive information possible on actually started research in the field of primary care in its earliest possible stages. The reason for doing so was that in the Netherlands at the time - the university institutes of general medicine had hardly started - much research was undertaken by individual general practitioners who often were quite unaware that other physicians were involved in exactly the same material at the very same time. Little benefit was derived of knowledge that had been acquired in other investigations. Much experience (in particular that of negative results:) was lost. Moreover it was suspected that there existed both enormous overlaps and large blanks. But these became never really manifest because a comprehensive view of the situation was lacking. But when during ten years research data in a certain area are systematically collected, there will come a moment when such an overview does arise. This overview will then acquire some intrinsic significance besides the information value it has for fellow-investigators. On the basis of this intrinsic significance, the Registration System was recently given a second objective: to operate as an aid in the conduct of research

matters concerning primary health care. The second objective is closely connected with the current tendency in the Dutch research world to coordinate scientific research to a greater extent through better programming of the research and, as a result, better control of it.

As part of this trend, the present aim is to lay down research policies for important areas of health care research. Proceeding on the W.H.O. objective of "strengthening primary care" (an objective which is also endorsed by the Dutch Ministry of Public Health and Environmental Hygiene), primary care is sure to be one section to receive explicit attention. It is hoped that this article may be a useful aid in this respect. But apart from these two more or less permanent objectives of the Registration System, this book pursues another goal: the communication abroad of knowledge of the scientific research conducted in the Netherlands in the field of primary care.

In the Netherlands many investigations are carried out in the field of primary care. Seldom, however, the results of this research have been published in a foreign language. This is to be regretted, for the scope of Dutch-spoken civilization is but small. Knowledge and experience acquired here in the Netherlands hardly ever cross the border. Therefore, in this article, we shall present a survey of

- what research in and into primary health care has been conducted in the Netherlands during the past ten years
- what developments have occured in the course of the vears
- which areas of research have evolved well and where the gaps are
- what kind of relationship there is between university-based and other research, between research originating in institutions and research by individual general practitioners
- what return the research projects yield in the form of publications.

With this, we hope to make Dutch research in the field of primary health care more widely known. And this, then, is the most important aim of this book.

For the purpose of this survey, the following general definition has been formulated:

The problem definition of the research project or at least one of the subsidiary problem definitions must concern the structure, the organization or the functioning of primary health care as a whole or of one or more of the disciplines working in it.

On the model of suggestions made in this connection to the Mistry of Public Health and Environmental Hygiene, the following disciplines were considered to belong to primary health care

- general practitioner
- district nurse
- social worker
- physical therapist
- midwife
- family visitor
- dentist
- sick attendant
- pharmaceutical chemist
- dietician
- other professional help.

In the Netherlands, the division between primary care and other sections of health care is much sharper than in most other countries. This appears, e.g., from the fact only primary care workers are freely accessible to patients (and even of these some are not; a physical therapist, e.g., can not be consulted until a referral has been provided by a general practitioner). If a patient wants to visit a specialist, e.g., the patient must first ask a referral card from the general practitioner. This strict separation a primary care and other sections

of health care we also maintained in this article. Thus, what has been left out of the survey is:

- 1. All research into basic health care (public health, the mass population screenings and other general inquiries) excluding, however,
  - a. well-baby clinics (because in all cases district nurses and often general practitioners as well are involved in their work);
  - b. dental care (because equally here no clear line could be drawn between primary care and basic health care.
- 2. All research in or into secondary and tertiary health care both somatic and mental (i.e. specialist care and mental health care).
- 3. All research in which research data are collected directly among the population without any intervention of primary health care workers and where the problem definition does not indicate in how far the structure, the organization or the functioning of primary health care or any of its subdivisions is concerned.

If we submit the research projects to these critical criteria for selection, and remove all investigations of which the relation with primary care is doubtful, we are left with all in all 452 investigations. These 452 investigations are what the rest of this article is about.

One may wonder in how far these 452 investigations render a complete picture of the research conducted in the Netherlands during the past ten years in the field of primary health care.

It can also be doubted whether the location of the Registration System (in the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners) would not result in a onesided selection from among the investigations. We tried to find this out by means of a few interviews we had with key figures in other areas of work. The impression is that this article gives a fairly representative view of the situation. The only systematic bias we were able to trace concerns research in the field of dental care. In this


category, under-reporting seems to have taken place. But now some figures.

Numbers of new research projects throughout the years

For several reasons, it might be expected that the number of new research projects in and into primary health care would increase over the years. In the first place, by the end of the sixties and in the beginning of the seventies, general practitioners' institutes came into being subsequently in all Dutch universities; a development that had fully matured around the middle of the seventies when all general practitioners' institutes had become fully staffed. Besides teaching, the conducting of scientific research is one of the main tasks of these institutes. At government level, too, increasing attention has come to be paid to primary health care in the course of the period under review. Ever since the so called "Structure Memorandum" of the Dutch Ministry of Public Health and Environmental Hygiene was published in 1974, the policy-related intentions of this Ministry have focused on the development and reinforcement of primary health care. In theory, these intentions could affect the number of new research projects, in this field in two ways. First. very generally, through the reallocation of resources from specialist research to primary care research. in order to enable primary care to take up its own development more effectively. But also quite directly, in that the Ministry itself might grant research commissions for the planning and evaluation of its own policy which is directed at reinforcement of primary care.

Figure 1, however, shows that no increase in the number of newly registered research projects is apparent.

A rise, though, can be observed in 1974, the year of publication of the said Structure Memorandum (this, however, is immediately in 1975, followed by a decline), and a second rise in 1977 which is less easily explained. The the total graph, however certainly fails to show an increase, perhaps it rather shows a slight decline (i.e. during the last three years). Now the number of new research projects is not the only standard used to measure research efforts. The scope of the projects is another one. Regrettably, we have no data on the financial dimensions of the projects. Yet, inquiries were made into the estimated duration, which is an indication of the project's scale as well. In tabel 1. these data are grouped concerning two basic periods. (1971-1975 inclusive and 1976-1980 inclusive).

We then see that the percentage of research projects of longer duration than two years increases considerably (from 52% to 66%). The last measure of ascertaining the extent of primary care research is the percentage of projects that is successfully concluded – i.e. by publishing the results. Table 2. shows in what way the investigations were terminated. Here, too, two five-year periods have been distinghuished.

The most interesting figure in this table is provided by category 5: "ceased without publication". All in all, about a fourth of primary care research was ceased without the results being published. The majority of these failures, however, took place in the first five-year period (n=80). In this period, premature termination even was the commonest manner of ending. That percentage fell steeply in the second five-year period.

In summary, we can state — somewhat surprisingly — the number of new research projects in and into primary care did not increase between 1971 and 1980. Yet, the new projects did become more extensive and the research output increased considerably, at least, if in measuring this we can go by the percentage of investigations that is concluded with external publication of the results.

# The working organizations

Table 3 presents a fairly detailed view of which institutes or research workers make the research efforts for primary care.

We see that the Dutch universities account for nearly half of all primary care research. The largest part of this (30% in total) is carried out by General Practitioners' Institutes of the universities, with Nijmegen being the obvious leader. But other university institutes also conduct research in the field of primary health care, particularly those of social medicine and the behavioural sciences. A comparatively large amount of research is conducted in the research institutes grant-aided by the Ministry of Public Health and Environmental Hygiene, among which the Netherlands General Practitioners' Institute with its share of 10% of all primary care research is easily first - no wonder, for that matter, in view of the ministerial intention to allow this institute to grow into an institute for the whole of primary health care.

Further, it is noteworthy that single general practitioners perform such a large share of all primary care research: no less than a fourth of primary care research is conducted indepently of any official research institute. Especially group paractices and health centres remain fertile ground for research (an important phenomenon that is often forgotten in the discussions on the usefulness of group practices and health centres!) It is true, though, that the number of non-institutional investigations diminished in the course of the years; probably because many of their staff were attracted by the university institutes.

It is an alluring prospect to analyse the effectiveness of the various main groups' research projects more closely. Table 4. presents the figures. In it, the same classification as in tabel has been maintained.

To a certain degree, this table puts the optimistic views of non-institutional research in a less favourable perspective: no less than 40% of such research ends up without being published. It is a pity that of the research efforts so much should be lost in this way. These prematurely terminated projects yet occur mainly in the first five-year period and include the soloist practitioners who do not succeed in crowning their investigation by publication. The output of group practices and health centres is higher. We can derive another conclusion from the table: that the original form of publication (i.e. the way in which research is concluded) is different for each kind of research organization. For

the staff of university institutes and "detached" research workers an article in a periodical is the most—used form of publication in comparison with other groups. For grand—aided institutions and also for TNO—departments, it is a research report. An explanation is furnished by the fact that in these institutions contract research is the rule, which implies that at the end of a project a report must be submitted to the principal. Finally, it should be noted that, if compared to university institutes, only few research projects in grant—aided institutions culminate in a doctor's thesis. Here, too, contract procedures and the character of the research conducted by these institutions which is that of applied science, are sure to make their influence felt.

A rough classification of research themes——

To provide an understanding of the subjects on which primary care research focuses, we devided the research projects in three main groups:

- 1. Research which deals with overall health care as far as explicit attention is paid to primary care, including research into the relationship of primary to other sections of health care.
- 2. Research concerned with primary care as a service system including research into bilateral and multidisciplinary collaboration in primary care.
- 3. Research which concentrates exclusively on one of the disciplines operating in primary care. Each of these three main groups is further subdivided in a number of subcategories (see table 5.).

If we consider the total column, we see that the large majority of primary care research (66%) falls in the third category: research into one discipline. Of this, the major part in its turn goes to the general practitioner and general medicine (82%). The general practitioner remains the central figure in primary health care, also with regard to research focused strictly on one discipline only. The categories I and II (of "health care" and "primary health care" respectively) each account for no more than 17% of research as a whole. For all this, though, this feature has been changing for some time, and in particular an increase in research focusing on more than one section of health care has been manifest. Especially research into the relationship between primary and specialist/intramural care has become a favourite. In absolute numbers, this is the second most frequent research subject (10% of all projects), after research concerned exclusively with the general practitioner (54%). Third is research into multidisciplinary co-operation (8%). Noteworthy are further research concerning nurses (including wellbaby clinics): 6%, and research concerning health care in general (5%) and primary care in general (6%). The numbers in other categories are insignificant when compared to the whole. But now we can have a closer look.

Research into the whole of health care (with some attention to primary care)

We already saw that in recent years research into health care in general with reference to primary health care has enjoyed increasing attention. This kind of research has nearly doubled in the past five years in comparison with the first five-year period. This increase is largely due to so-called "health services research": research into health care as a system. In the "general" category, e.g., this type of research accounts for two thirds of the aggregate. "Planning", "organization", "control", "cost", and "financing" are the key words. The preparations for

the Health Care Facilities Act are manifest in the new research projects of several institutes. Another development is that more often than before, the patients are asked for their opinion on the relative functioning of various sections of health care. This sometimes concerns the opinion of health care generally, but more often that of specific forms (assistance to drug addicts, counseling on sexual problems, etc.). We may mention seven such inquiries in the past five years against a single one in the first five-year period. The relation between primary and secondary health care is, as we already observed, one of the most popular areas of research. But while in theory relationships between all primary health care workers and the entire secondary care could come into consideration, we yet find that in the majority of research projects the attention is concentrated on the relation of general practitioner to specialist, and even remains restricted to its quantitative aspects, the referrals. In more general terms, table 6. shows (convincingly) that the specialist/ intramural level of somatic health care receives much more attention than mental health care and that general practitioners receive much more attention than their fellow primary care workers.

Whoever would have expected that the increasing preoccupation with reinforcement of primary health care,
collaboration at primary health care level, etc.,
would be reflected in a relative decline of the
exclusive concentration on the relation of the
general practitioner to the specialist, must be
deceived. From table 7. (where for both five-year
periods studies concerning the G.P.-specialist
relation are contrasted with all other forms of
research into the relation of primary and secondary
care) it appears that rather the reverse has happened
(significance at 10% level).

Research into the primary — secondary care relation—ship is also more popular than research into primary care and other sections of health care. In particular the relation of primary care to basic health care has not been inspiring enough for a single investigator to study it.

This is to be regretted, for, just as co-operation is needed and tensions exist between the primary and secondary levels of somatic and mental health care, the same may be expected to be true of primary care

and basic care.

This area of research is underdeveloped. There has been, on the other hand, considerable awareness, especially during the past five years, of self-help and non-professional assistance from the patient's direct environment and their relationship to professional services. But here, too, it is remarkable that while the Cross Organization (i.e. the nationwide organization of district nurses) has been the first of primary care organizations to refer expressly to self-help in its policy-planning, yet hardly any research into the relation of district nursing to self-help has resulted. Most studies in the field of self-help are either focused on the relationship with the general practitioner or on the phenomenon itself.

Research in or into primary health care———

The notion of "primary health care" as referring to a seperate system of services has arisen in the course of the period under review. At first as a diffuse idea understood differently by each writer; later on more clear—cut and more strictly defined. The already been mentioned Structure Memorandum and the Outlines of Primary Health Care have been crucial memorandums in that they contributed to the notion's taking on definite shape and being accepted in the world of primary health care.

It also happened in the period under review that the idea of primary health care gained political importance. "Strenghtening primary health care", even at the cost of secondary care, is included in the official policy planning of the Ministry of Public Health. Do we see all this reflected in research? At first cursory glance, table 1. is disappointing. For, really not much research is conducted in primary health care at all and moreover the number of new studies seems to decrease over the years. A closer examination of the research project in this category throws a somewhat different light on the disappointing data. In the first half of the period under review,

we especially find research into bilateral and multidisciplinary collaboration (75% of the aggregate research of this period). Health centres in particular attracted much interest between 1971 and 1976. During the last five years, a shift has occurred towards research into the service system at primary level: inventories of collaboration arrangements and - on a line with what we observed in the preceding paragraph - much reference to organizational forms. planning and control, financing problems and the like. Here, too, health services research receives increasing attention. Between this type of research in the main group of "primary care" and the main group of "health care" the differences often are tiny and unessential (think e.g., of studies of the primary - secondary care relationship). All taken together we may therefore conclude that the preoccupation with bilateral and multidisciplinary collaboration flourished in the first five-years period. At present much research is conducted into primary health care as a service system and the relationships of this system to other service systems (such as secondary care).

## A few more findings:

- most of the research is of a descriptive nature. Research into the effectiveness or efficiency of multidisciplinary primary care is rarely found. In no more than ten studies the evaluative character prevails (as against 34 studies in which an inventory or a process description receive the main stress).
- Research into joint support of primary care is rare and all of it (n = 3) is of a recent date. In this connection we mention studies of multidisciplinary post graduate courses (on birth control), of (a method of) multidisciplinary patient reviewing and of a multidisciplinary classification list to be evolved.
- It is further remarkable that in the first fiveyear period many inquiries were made after the

patients' opinion of the (new) health centre (n = 5). Financially the transition from singlehanded practice to health centre was at the time often accompanied by investigations. This type of research is no longer found in the past five years.

Researches into bilateral collaboration (n = 17) mainly took place in the first five-year period (76%). At present this kind of research attracts little interest. With two exceptions the general practitioner was one partner in the collaborative arrangement. (The two exceptions concerned district nurses). The other partner was, in order of incidence, the psychologist (8x), the social worker (5x) and the physical therapist (3x).Other disciplines were not represented. Thus, once more

we find here a disproportionate concentration on

some primary care disciplines while other disciplines appear hardly or not al all.

The prominence of the general practitioner is most evident when we consider main group III — research focused on a single discipline, 80% at first, later even 84% of researches in this category concentrate on the general practitioner. Especially during the first few years, district nursing enjoyed a degree of interest in the research sphere (due mainly to the stimulating and initiating role taken by SSLK, the forerunner of the National Cross Organization), but for the rest the map shows many blanks. With obvious consequences, the general practitioner is the only primary care worker to have a university background. The other occupational groups not only lack this academic support, but even the interest of other research institutes.

So the study of the general practitioner attracts many interested investigators, so many that a separate paragraph is justified.

Studies of the general practitioner—

Researches that focus on the general practitioner are classified in three categories:

- 1. research into condition-setting features
- 2. research into the (overall) morbidity in general practices
- 3. research into the professional help given by the general practitioner

Table 8. presents an overview for both five—year periods of the research classified in these cate—gories. (Table 8: see next page).

- 1. Research into condition-setting features Nearly a fourth of the investigations focused on the general practitioner (23% = 12% of aggregate primary care research) concerns the condition-setting feature of the trade of a general practitioner. The majority of this is devoted to research into organizational aspects of practice management by the general practitioner (problem-oriented registration, automation. diagnostic aids, etc.). Also 16 studies were counted which involve quality improvement and control (training, postgraduate courses, testing). Research into the structure of the occupational group of general medicine constitutes the last category, which has resulted in a continuous stream of (partial) studies and reports. Apart from the latter development no trends can be pointed out within this main group.
- 2. Research into the (overall) morbidity in general practices

The well-known, long-term projects on epidemiological lines belong to this category, such as the Continuous Morbidity Registration of the Nijmegen University. General Practitioners' Institute, and the Sentinal Station project of the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners. A number of incidental morbidity investigations were classified with this category as well, including parts of the 'monitoring project' in Ommoord. The small decrease that emerges from table 8. is artificial and partly explained by

the long-term projects which were all counted among the first five-year period projects.

3. Research into the professional help given by the general practitioner In the Netherlands much research is directed at the services rendered by the general practitioner. This kind of research comprises 67% of the investigations concentrating on the general practitioner and no less than 36% of aggregate primary care research! A large proportion of such research concerns professional help methods in general. The relationship of general practitioner to patient is a favourite subject, as is the decision procedure that general practitioners use in their work. Recently, investigators have also become interested in Methodical Working as introduced by the Netherlands College of General Practitioners. In the first five-vear period inquiries were made regularly into the help general practitioners gave to specific groups of the population (such as women and old-age pensioners). In the second five-year period this type of research greatly diminished (e.g., hardly any research is conducted into the services rendered to groups that are now considered vulnerable, such as immigrants, unemployed persones). The help given with various complaint patterns, on the other hand, is extensively studied. In this, a noticeable change in the course of time from research in connection with diffuse and wide-spread complaints to a limited number of clear-cut complaints. Most popular is research into the detection and treatment of cardiovascular disease, but other chronic illness also score high. A third important category is research into the treatment of psychosomatic disorders. Finally it appears that the task of the general practitioner in obstetrics and juvenile health care is regularly studied. A common feature of the above complaints is that all of them have links with the pressures between primary care and neighbouring sections. This apparently lends an extra stimulus to research. The last group to be mentioned must be the investigations of the prescribing of

medicines by the general practitioner. Although prescribing medicines is a common phenomenon in a general practice (in 60% of visits the interview is concluded with a prescription being given), we find that the extent and manner of prescribing by the general practitioner are the subject of comparatively little research; and decidedly so if we contrast it with the researches made of other modes of treatment open to the general practitioner, in particular the referrals to the medical specialist (see p. 23). This is the more remarkable if we bear in mind that the consumption of medicine is an important cost item in health care. Here, too, an underdeveloped area to lie waiting.

#### Summary and conclusions —

In the foregoing, a general overview was presented of the past ten years of research carried out in the Netherlands in the field of primary health care. A general overview only. For a more detailed survey the reader is refered to the reports from the Registration System for Current Research in and into Primary Care published by the Netherlands Institute of General Practitioners. This summer a special report will be published in english with a detailed description of all the 452 research projects that have been carried out during the last ten years (including the names and adresses of the researchers). What stands out clearly is who in the Netherlands conduct research in the field of primary health care: about half of it is for account of the universities; a relatively large amount is carried out by government-aided institutes, and - unexpectedly - by individual general practitioners, who may or may not work in group practices and health centres. A few tendencies emerge from the survey. Another unexpected finding is that the number of investigations made in and about primary care fails to show an increase with time, in spite of all planning aimed at strengthening primary care. It is true, though, that the investigations have a longer average duration and

are more frequently concluded with external publications. Less obvious is the fact that by far the majority of researches concentrates on the general practitioner (and medical care). With this result, the age-old idea that the general practitioner is the central figure in primary care is not only confirmed once again, but even reinforced! Indeed, the other primary care disciplines are hardly given a chance to define themselves by means of research. The lack of an academic tradition behind these disciplines is probably to blame, as well as the absence of research bodies with a traditional orientation towards the other primary care disciplines or pressure groups to push research in their own field of action. In this connection it is worth mentioning that at the beginning of the seventies the functioning of district nurses was comparatively much studied. This happened at the time when the SSLK (forerunner of the National Cross Organization) was actively engaged in stimulating research and had found, in the ITS (Institute of Applied Sociology), a research institute who was willing to conduct a series of research projects in this field.

All this, however, slackened with time (at present the National Cross Organization no longer has an active policy regarding research and neither has it any research projects of its own in hand).

We further see that in general medicine a concentration of research activities has taken place. In the course of time the subjects to attract much notice have clearly come to be restricted in number. The relationship of primary to secondary care (including referrals) is one of them. This theme has manifestly evolved further than other themes which are concerned with the general practitioner's activities on the one hand and the cost of health care on the other (for there often is a connection). In this context we think, e.g., of the prescribing of medicines, which as a subject of research clearly lags behind the

study of referrals. In investigations concerned with typical general medicine a distinct focusing of research activities has accourred as well. Much attention tends to be paid here to cardiovascular disease and, more generally to complaints lying on the border of general medicine and its neighbouring sections. In itself such a concentration of research activities is a reason to rejoice. It ensures the accumulation of knowledge because investigators may benefit from the results and methods of each other's research. However, it also implies that specific areas are systematically passed over. This survey aims at finding such gaps.
